Individuals Elected to National Honor Societies

In a program unique to Sigma Phi, since 1963 the Standing & Advisory Committee has honored brothers elected to membership in any of several national senior honor societies.

This recognition program has a very straightforward objective: To promote scholarship, leadership, and character among the Society's members.

So that award recipients may be properly recognized, the Scholastic Recognition Committee asks that all chapters and/or their alumni organizations provide the following information for each award recipient:

- Individual's full, proper name and initiation year
- Name of honorary society
- When the honor was conferred
- The cost of the organization's basic insignia/pin (<u>not</u> entire initiation fee)
- Address to which reimbursement is to be sent, if requested

In addition to having his achievement(s) announced at a convention and in the Society's publications, each honored brother will be reimbursed for the cost of his insignia if he so requests. With a variety of insignia being offered by some honor societies, some of them very expensive, there is a \$135 cap on the reimbursable cost.

The roster of national senior honor societies recognized by Sigma Phi evolves as the societies continuously realign and new ones emerge.
